



An Anniversary 25 years in the Making

While our logo, name, leadership and goals have changed over the years, one thing has remained the same: our mission to make the most of what Michigan City has to offer. At the core of the Economic Development Corporation Michigan City is our belief that we can spark the positivity needed to cultivate change and momentum for all of our community members who live, work or visit our city and the region.

We were founded in 1997 as the Michigan City Economic Development Corporation by former Michigan City Mayor Sheila Brillson along with the city's Chamber of Commerce and key business leaders: Michael Brennan, Phillip Sprague, Terry Hearst, Bob Schaefer and former postmaster, Roger McKee. This team put together our organization's bylaws and strategic goals for the initial years of our existence. Brillson was our first chair until June 2003, and Tony Rodriguez was our first executive director.

Originally, the cornerstones that were created to guide our team included: Organizational Development, Product Development, External Development, Retention & Expansion and Workforce Development. By having these tenets as a framework, our leadership and board members were able to follow a cohesive approach to building a strong foundation in the development of Michigan City. There were many events that started over the years to help carry out these goals, including jobs fairs, our Business Investment Awards and Made in LaPorte County.

We have also strengthened our partnerships with city, county, industry, business and nonprofits leaders to ensure that we are addressing all aspects of life here in our community. Through new and existing partnerships, we have pinpointed active ways to focus on the needs of our diverse population – from studying how to tackle food deserts to developing our future workforce through the Compressed Air Academy.

As we celebrate our Silver Anniversary in 2022, we are still serving as a resource for entrepreneurs, promoting educational opportunities, attracting and retaining various businesses and development projects and uniting leaders from all sectors. We will continue to move toward progress and change through the application of our current Strategic Plan, which includes workforce development and talent attraction, economic modernization, placemaking and aggressively telling our city's story.

We have always understood that quality of life and economic development go hand-in-hand, and this concept has driven our varied teams, mission and goals forward since the beginning. We are looking forward to many more years to come as we strive to work hard and dedicate our efforts to growth and development every day.



Phoenix Hwardees — Real Estate Reuse

Our three award winners have reinvented a space or existing facility in Michigan City to spur a momentous transformation that has had compelling impact on the community. The "rising-from-the-ashes" reinventions have resulted in new investment in their businesses, new jobs and an enhanced product or service.

Zorn Brew Works

The brewery has been revived after decades of sitting idle. It was originally launched by Philip Zorn Jr. in 1871. A brewer's son, Philip used a spring-fed well to produce an iconic brand of beer until closing in 1938. After 79 years of waiting to be reborn, the Zorn Brew Works taproom is now in the former carriage house on the grounds of the historic brewery. Today, the brewery churns out its own brew of beer and also serves up food.

Barrelhouse at Zorn

The rejuvenation of the Zorn campus continued when the Barrelhouse at Zorn was added to the Zorn Brew Works campus. It is a restored and renovated venue for events and weddings that includes a bridal suite, private dining room, bar and outdoor patio. The design is modern and industrial and includes original pieces, such as brickwork, beams and floors.

Leeds Public House

The restaurant at the corner of Fourth and Franklin streets reinvented the spot with indoor and outdoor seating and an energetic vibe. The restaurant took its name from the original moniker that still graces the top of the building. Brunch, lunch, dinner, seasonal dishes and specialty cocktails are on the menu with a side of community impact through the team's give-back program that supports nonprofits: Leeds Project Heart.



Leadership Awardees for Economic Development

Our two honorees have impacted economic development through their service to quality of life in our communities. This award recognizes individuals who have boosted economic development in a manner that is vital to how our city has evolved as well as showcased a sense of community. Nora Ryszka, environmental steward

- Nora's clean-up endeavor was established when she and her children were walking along Michigan City beach in 2018. They discovered items that needed to be picked up by hand.
- She launched her ongoing community effort to organize volunteers who are armed with grabbers and buckets to clean up Washington Park Beach on Mondays.
- Her culture of cleaning has extended beyond the beach to the streets with her Great Green Clean to spark even more community spirit.
- Nora and her glass artist husband, John Ryszka II, were inspired to return to their hometown of Michigan City after seeing the momentum of the area and wanting to become more involved. "The beauty of a small town, and one that is focused on growth and improving, is that it is easy to become involved! If I see something that I think needs improvement, I get to work!"



Dion Campbell, Michigan City Chief of Police

- Dion is a 22-year veteran of the department and has served in varied roles, including School Resource Office, Detective, Hostage Negotiator and Community Liaison Officer.
- He is a lifelong resident of the city and has received many citations, awards and achievements for his law enforcement career and beyond.
- He works to build up our youth through the creation of the Michigan City Police Department Youth Leadership Academy as well as participating in the Bridge to Manhood program as a lead instructor. This program strives to teach 13- to 17-yearolds how to become successful young men.
- Chief Campbell was tested as a leader with the department and within the community when he led officers during the 2020 protests spurred by the death of George Floyd. He was able to help balance the safety of the businesses and citizens with the protesters' desire for change.

They have all served in various sectors and blazed their way as visionaries who have not only led but also mentored those in our communities. Patricia Boy – State Representative since 2018, Former EDCMC Board Member, Former City Council Member

- Pat owned a 24-hour secretarial/data management business with her husband from 1988-2016.
- Her time on the Michigan City Common Council included assisting with community development, labor negotiations, economic development and overhauling the Michigan City Municipal Code.
- She was encouraged to run for the council after she helped her neighbors protect a wetland.
- Her community involvement includes: member of the Better Government Study Group; member and past president of League of Women Voters of LaPorte County; representative to Drug-Free Partnership; member of the LaPorte County Chapter of the NAACP; and current member and past president of the nonpartisan League of Women Voters of LaPorte County.







Craig Dwight - Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Horizon Bank



- He continued to be active in the ED arena by serving on the board, assisting in recruiting, facilitating the first strategic planning session and coordinating the Circle of Investors Campaign to help fund the EDCMC and partner agency: La Porte Economic Advancement Partnership.
- His community involvement includes: serving on the Long Beach Town Council, helping form the Unity Foundation of LaPorte County as well as serving on its board and being a board member for the Center of Workforce Innovation.
